- 9 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That the terms of the
- 10 members of a board of regents of Bowie State University, Coppin State College,
- 11 Frostburg State University, Salisbury University, Towson University, University of
- 12 Baltimore, University of Maryland, Baltimore, University of Maryland Baltimore
- 13 County, University of Maryland, College Park, University of Maryland Eastern Shore,
- 14 and University of Maryland University College appointed on October 2, 2004, shall
- 15 expire as follows:
- 16 (1) three in 2006;
- 17 (2) three in 2008; and
- 18 (3) three in 2010.
- 19 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publisher of the
- 20 Annotated Code, in consultation with, and subject to the approval of the Department
- 21 of Legislative Services, shall correct all references to the University System of
- 22 Maryland rendered incorrect by this Act.
- 23 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any property that is
- 24 owned or operated on September 30, 2004, by the University System of Maryland
- 25 shall be transferred in equal shares to Bowie State University, Coppin State College,
- 26 Frostburg State University, Salisbury University, Towson University, University of
- 27 Baltimore, University of Maryland, Baltimore, University of Maryland Baltimore
- 28 County, University of Maryland, College Park, University of Maryland Eastern Shore,
- 29 and University of Maryland University College. Any property transferred under this
- 30 section that is in dispute or is not in use as of December 31, 2004, shall be sold by
- 31 public auction. The proceeds from this sale shall be deposited into a scholarship fund
- 32 for in-State tuition to Bowie State University, Coppin State College, Frostburg State
- 33 University, Salisbury University, Towson University, University of Baltimore,
- 34 University of Maryland, Baltimore, University of Maryland Baltimore County,
- 35 University of Maryland, College Park, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, or
- 36 University of Maryland University College for Maryland residents.
- 37 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 38 effect October 1, 2004.
