Procurement - Small Business Procurement Contracts - Reserve Preference

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Small Business Reserve Program; designating the

4 types of procurements in which the Small Business Reserve Program may

5 participate; requiring certain procurement units to achieve a certain percentage

6 of small business procurement contracts under the Program; requiring the

7 Department of General Services to establish certain procedures to assist small

8 businesses; requiring certain procurement units to report to the Board of Public

9 Works by a certain date; providing for the application of certain provisions of

10 this Act; providing that the total dollar value of procurements by certain

11 procurement units do not include the value of certain contracts to which this Act

12 <u>does not apply because of a conflict with federal law;</u> defining certain terms;

13 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to small

(B) (C) A DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT SHALL STRUCTURE ITS

23 (A) THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS
24 TO ESTABLISH PROCEDURES FOR COMPILING AND MAINTAINING A COMPREHENSIVE
25 BIDDER'S LIST OF QUALIFIED SMALL BUSINESSES THAT SHALL BE POSTED ON THE
26 DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE.

27 (B) EACH DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT SHALL ENSURE COMPLIANCE
28 WITH THE REGULATIONS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

30 (A) ANY PROCUREMENT BY A DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT OF GOODS,
31 SUPPLIES, SERVICES, MAINTENANCE, CONSTRUCTION, CONSTRUCTION-RELATED
32 SERVICES, ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES, AND ENGINEERING SERVICES SHALL BE
33 ELIGIBLE FOR DESIGNATION FOR THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE.

(B) A SOLICITATION FOR PROCUREMENT THAT HAS BEEN DESIGNATED FOR A
SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE SHALL BE PUBLISHED IN THE SAME MANNER AS
REQUIRED FOR AN INVITATION FOR BIDS AS SET FORTH IN § 13-103(C) OF THIS
ARTICLE.

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(C) THE PROCUREMENT OFFICER OF A DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT
 SHALL AWARD A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT DESIGNATED FOR A SMALL BUSINESS
 RESERVE TO THE SMALL BUSINESS THAT SUBMITS A RESPONSIVE BID THAT:

4 (1) IS THE LOWEST BID PRICE;

5 (2) IF THE INVITATION FOR BIDS SO PROVIDES, IS THE LOWEST 6 EVALUATED BID PRICE; OR

7 (3) IS THE BID OR PROPOSAL MOST FAVORABLE TO THE STATE WITHIN 8 THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE.

10 (A) WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE END OF EACH FISCAL YEAR, EACH
11 DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT ON THE OPERATION
12 AND EFFECTIVENESS OF THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE PROGRAM TO THE BOARD
13 OF PUBLIC WORKS.

14 (B) WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER RECEIPT OF ALL REPORTS REQUIRED UNDER
15 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS SHALL COMPILE
16 THE INFORMATION AND REPORT ON THE ENTIRE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE
17 PROGRAM TO THE LEGISLATIVE POLICY COMMITTEE, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE
18 STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take

20 effect October 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end

21 of September 30, 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this

22 Act, and any regulations adopted under the provisions of this Act, shall be abrogated

23 and of no further force and effect.
