State Government - Office of Legislative Audits - Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Legislative Audits to audit conduct certain

- 5 <u>audits of the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners (Board) to</u>
- 6 investigate whether there has been certain wrongdoing by the Board; requiring
- 7 the employees of the Office of Legislative Audits to have access to certain
- 8 records of the Board under certain circumstances; authorizing the Legislative
- 9 Auditor to report to the Attorney General any alleged criminal violation by a
- 10 person discovered during the course of an audit; requiring the Attorney General
- 11 to keep a certain report of an alleged criminal violation confidential under
- 12 certain circumstances; authorizing the Attorney General to investigate and
- 13 prosecute any alleged criminal violation reported by the Legislative Auditor
- 14 under certain circumstances; authorizing the Attorney General to exercise all
- 15 the powers and duties of a State's Attorney to investigate and prosecute certain
- 16 alleged criminal violations under certain circumstances; and generally relating
- 17 to an audit of the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners.

LEGISLATIVE AUDITOR MAY REPORT THE ALLEGED VIOLATION TO THE ATTORNEY
GENERAL.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 June 1, 2004.
