A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System - Membership - Maryland Forest and Parks Service Managers

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing membership for certain law enforcement officers of

- 5 the Maryland Forest and Parks Service who are employed by the Department of
- 6 Natural Resources in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; and
- 7 generally relating to pensions for supervisory and managerial law enforcement
- 8 officers of the Maryland Forest and Parks Service who are employed by the
- 9 Department of Natural Resources.

10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 11 Article State Personnel and Pensions
- 12 Section 26-201 and 26-202
- 13 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 14 (1997 Replacement Volume and 2003 Supplement)

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
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Article - State Personnel and Pensions

18 26-201.

19 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this subtitle applies 20 only to:

- 21 (1) an employee of the Department of Natural Resources commissioned22 by the Secretary of Natural Resources as:
- 23 (i) a Natural Resources police officer; [or]
- 24 (ii) a law enforcement officer, other than a Natural Resources police
- 25 officer; OR

1 (III) A SUPERVISORY OR MANAGERIAL LAW ENFORCEMENT 2 OFFICER OF THE MARYLAND FOREST AND PARKS SERVICE ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 3 1, 2004;
4 (2) a law enforcement officer employed by the Field Enforcement 5 Division;
6 (3) a member of the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force 7 who has the powers granted to a police officer under § 4-208 of the Transportation 8 Article;
9 (4) a deputy sheriff employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's 10 Department;
11 (5) a member of the University of Maryland Police Force who has the 12 powers granted to a police officer under § 13-601 of the Education Article;
 13 (6) a law enforcement officer employed by a participating governmental 14 unit that on or after July 1, 1999 has elected to participate in the Law Enforcement 15 Officers' Pension System;
16 (7) the State Fire Marshal or a Deputy State Fire Marshal;
17(8)a member of the Morgan State University Police Force who has the18powers granted to a police officer under § 14-106 of the Education Article;
19 (9) a member of the BWI Airport Fire & Rescue Department;
 20 (10) a member of the Department of General Services Police Force who 21 has the powers granted to a police officer under § 4-605 of the State Finance and 22 Procurement Article;
 (11) an employee of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene commissioned by the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene as a Health and Mental Hygiene police officer;
 26 (12) an employee of the Motor Vehicle Administration commissioned by 27 the Secretary of the Department of Transportation as a Motor Vehicle Administration 28 police officer;
 (13) an employee of the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation commissioned by the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation as a Labor, Licensing, and Regulation police officer;
 32 (14) a firefighter for the Martin State Airport employed by the Military 33 Department; or
34 (15) a police officer employed by the Division of Rehabilitation Services in

35 the Department of Education, certified in accordance with the Maryland Police and
36 Correctional Training Commissions.

(b) This subtitle does not apply to:

2 (1) a Maryland Transportation Authority police officer who transferred
3 from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension System on or after
4 December 1, 1996;

5 (2) a deputy sheriff employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's
6 Department who transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the
7 Employees' Pension System on or after December 1, 1996;

8 (3) a member of the University of Maryland Police Force who transferred
9 from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension System on or after
10 December 1, 1997;

(4) a law enforcement officer employed by a participating governmental
unit who transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees'
Pension System on or after December 1, 1997;

14 (5) a Maryland Port Administration police officer who transferred from
15 the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension System on or after
16 December 1, 1997;

17 (6) a State Fire Marshal or Deputy State Fire Marshal who transferred
18 from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension System on or after
19 December 1, 1996;

20 (7) a member of the Morgan State University Police Force who 21 transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension 22 System on or after December 1, 1997;

23 (8) a member of the BWI Airport Fire & Rescue Department who
24 transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension
25 System on or after April 1, 1998;

26 (9) a member of the Department of General Services, Department of

27 Health and Mental Hygiene, Motor Vehicle Administration, or Department of Labor,28 Licensing, and Regulation Police Force who transferred from the Employees'

29 Retirement System to the Employees' Pension System on or after April 1, 1998;

30 (10) a firefighter for the Martin State Airport employed by the Military
31 Department who transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the
32 Employees' Pension System on or after April 1, 1998; [or]

33 (11) a police officer employed by the Division of Rehabilitation Services in
 34 the Department of Education who:

is certified in accordance with the Maryland Police and
 Correctional Training Commissions; and

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1(ii)transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the2Employees' Pension System on or after April 1, 1998; OR

3 (12) AN EMPLOYEE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES
4 COMMISSIONED BY THE SECRETARY OF NATURAL RESOURCES AS A SUPERVISORY
5 OR MANAGERIAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THE MARYLAND FOREST AND
6 PARKS SERVICE ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2004, WHO TRANSFERRED FROM THE
7 EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM ON OR
8 AFTER APRIL 1, 1998.

10 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, an individual described
11 in § 26-201 of this subtitle is a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension
12 System as a condition of employment.

13 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, membership in the Law
14 Enforcement Officers' Pension System is optional for an individual described in §
15 26-201 of this subtitle:

16 (i) who was employed by the Department of Natural Resources on 17 July 1, 1990 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

(ii) who was employed by the Field Enforcement Division on June
30, 1995 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

20 (iii) who was employed by the Maryland Transportation Authority 21 on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

(iv) who was employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's Department
on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

24 (v) who was employed by the University of Maryland Police Force 25 on June 30, 1999 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

26 (vi) who is employed by a participating governmental unit on the

27 effective date of participation on or after July 1, 1999 for that participating

28 governmental unit and who elects membership within 6 months of the effective date29 of participation;

(vii) who was employed by the Maryland Port Administration Police
Force and was subsequently transferred to and employed by the Maryland
Transportation Authority Police Force on July 1, 1998 and who elects membership on
or before December 31, 2002;

34 (viii) who was employed by the office of the State Fire Marshal on 35 June 30, 1998 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

(ix) who was employed by the Morgan State University Police Force
on June 30, 1999 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

1 (x) who was employed by the BWI Airport Fire & Rescue 2 Department on June 30, 2000, and who elects membership on or before December 31, 3 2002;

4 (xi) who was employed by the Department of General Services,
5 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Motor Vehicle Administration, and
6 Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation Police Force on June 30, 2000 and

7 who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

8 (xii) who was employed by the Military Department as a firefighter 9 at Martin State Airport on June 30, 2001, and who elects membership on or before 10 December 31, 2002; [or]

11 (xiii) who was employed on June 30, 2002, by the Division of 12 Rehabilitation Services in the Department of Education as a police officer certified in 13 accordance with the Maryland Police and Correctional Training Commissions, and

14 who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002; OR

15 (XIV) WHO AS AN EMPLOYEE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL
16 RESOURCES WAS COMMISSIONED BY THE SECRETARY OF NATURAL RESOURCES AS A
17 SUPERVISORY OR MANAGERIAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THE MARYLAND
18 FOREST AND PARKS SERVICE ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2004, AND WHO ELECTS
19 MEMBERSHIP ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2004.

20 (2) To elect to be a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension

21 System, an individual shall file a written application with the State Retirement

22 Agency.

(3) If an individual does not elect membership during the applicable
period specified under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the individual may not
become a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 July 1, 2004.
