SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2 Compact for Sound Government

- 3 FOR the purpose of providing that the General Assembly supports the establishment
- 4 of an ongoing mechanism for agreements between the State and its political
- 5 subdivisions that improve the life chances of certain populations, save public
- 6 resources by avoiding certain predictable long-term State expenditures, and
- 7 redirect a share of certain savings to ongoing efforts to improve the lives and
- 8 futures of vulnerable children and families at risk; and generally relating to the
- 9 establishment of a mechanism for agreement between the State and its political
- subdivisions to improve life changes for certain populations.
- WHEREAS, It costs less to invest in opportunity than to pay for failure; and
- WHEREAS, It is far less expensive to use our scarce public resources to pay for
- 13 drug treatment rather than for foster care, for preventive health care rather than for
- 14 emergency room care, and for an adequate public education rather than for detention
- 15 and incarceration; and
- WHEREAS, Many jurisdictions across the State have been working to improve
- 17 the life chances of vulnerable citizens by developing and funding initiatives that
- 18 create opportunities and avoid negative outcomes; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The successful implementation of these initiatives reduces future
- 20 liabilities on government for deep-end or remedial services; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Currently all such savings to the State revert to the State General
- 22 Fund; now, therefore, be it

- 1 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the 2 General Assembly supports the establishment of an ongoing mechanism for
- 3 agreements between the State and its 24 political subdivisions that:
- 4 (a) improve the life chances of five specific populations:
- 5 (1) young families in crisis;
- 6 (2) children entering school unprepared to learn and to succeed;
- 7 disconnected youth at risk of harming others or causing harm to
- 8 themselves;
- 9 recovering substance abusers with dependent children; and
- 10 (5) ex-offenders returning to society; and
- 11 (b) save scarce public resources by avoiding the predictable long-term State
- 12 expenditures associated with continued poor outcomes for the populations listed
- 13 above; and
- 14 (c) redirect a share of savings accrued by the agreements for ongoing efforts to
- 15 improve the lives and futures of vulnerable children and families at risk in the
- 16 political subdivisions where these efforts are underway; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That agreements established in accordance with this Resolution
- 18 would authorize the return of a significant portion of State General Fund savings and
- 19 any federal savings or increased revenue maximization allowed by law to the political
- 20 subdivisions of the State for further investment in opportunity, prevention, or early
- 21 intervention for the populations listed above to generate future savings; and be it
- 22 further
