House Bill 600

(Prince George's County Delegation)

Prince George's County - Alcoholic Beverages - Out-of-State Licensees PG 305-04

This bill prohibits in Prince George's County the issuance of a new Class A or Class D beer; beer and light wine; or beer, wine, and liquor license to any person, corporation, or limited liability company also holding either an alcoholic beverages license in any other state or the District of Columbia, or a majority interest in a corporation or limited liability company holding such a license. The bill allows current license holders to renew their licenses.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Prince George's County revenues could decrease minimally due to the prohibition against issuing a license to an entity that holds an alcoholic beverages license in any other state or the District of Columbia, or holds a majority interest in a corporation or limited liability company that has such a license. Expenditures would not be affected.

Small Business Effect: Potential meaningful.

Analysis

Current Law: While there is no prohibition in Prince George's County against the issuance of a Class A or Class D beer; beer and light wine; or beer, wine, and liquor license to a person, corporation, or limited liability company holding an alcoholic beverages license in any other state or the District of Columbia, or a majority interest in a

corporation or limited liability company holding such a license, several jurisdictions restrict issuance to current license holders only.

In Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Calvert, Charles, St. Mary's, and Washington counties, a Class A or Class D beer; beer and light wine; or beer, wine, and liquor license may not be issued, except by way of renewal, to a person, corporation, or limited liability company holding an alcoholic beverages license in any other state or the District of Columbia. In Baltimore City, a Class A or Class D beer; beer and light wine; or beer, wine, and liquor license may not be issued, except by way of renewal, to a person, corporation, or limited liability company holding an alcoholic beverages license in any other state.

Background: As of April 30, 2003, there were 242 Class A and Class D licensees in Prince George's County. Prince George's County advises that four of these licensees also hold an alcoholic beverages license in another state or the District of Columbia, or hold a majority interest in a corporation or limited liability company that has such a license.

Additional Information

Prior Introductions: An identical bill was introduced in the 2003 session as HB 613. The Economic Matters Committee reported the bill unfavorably.
