FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

Senate Bill 60 (Chairman, Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee) (By Request – Departmental – Natural Resources)

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Department of Natural Resources - Recreational Fishing Licenses

This departmental bill increases the fees for various recreational fishing licenses issued by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and establishes a nonresident fee category for specified licenses and stamps.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Special fund revenue increase of \$1.3 million in FY 2005 and \$1.5 million annually thereafter. The bill would not require additional expenditures.

Local Effect: The bill would not directly affect local operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: DNR has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). Legislative Services concurs with this assessment.

Analysis

Bill Summary/Current Law: The bill's changes to current law are shown in **Exhibit 1**.

Under current law, revenue generated from the sale of angler's licenses and trout stamps is deposited into the Fisheries Management and Protection Fund and used only for the scientific investigation, protection, propagation, and management of nontidal finfish. Revenue generated from the sale of Chesapeake Bay sport fishing licenses, special charter boat licenses, and pleasure boat decals is deposited into the Fisheries Research and Development Fund to be used for the replenishment, protection, and conservation of fish stocks caught by recreational anglers; enhancement of recreational fishing opportunities; and research regarding tidal fishery resources.

Background: According to DNR, the recreational fishing industry generates a total estimated economic output of \$1.06 billion. DNR advises that current license fees do not accurately reflect fisheries management costs. According to DNR, the revenue generated

under the bill will counter budget cutbacks, increasing administrative costs, and declining license sales and will enable DNR to supplement studies in order to sustain the industry.

In general, fees for recreational fishing licenses have not been substantively increased in Maryland in over a decade. A comparison of current fees in Maryland and other states in the region is shown in **Exhibit 2**.

State Revenues: Special fund revenues would increase by an estimated \$1,542,041 annually beginning in fiscal 2006, as shown in **Exhibit 3.** Due to the bill's October 1, 2004 effective date, special fund revenues would increase by an estimated \$1,324,613 in fiscal 2005. (DNR advises that approximately 85.9% of these licenses and stamps are sold between October 1 and July 1.)

Of the total annual increase in the out-years (\$1,542,041), an estimated \$639,493 would be deposited into the Fisheries Management and Protection Fund and \$902,548 would be deposited into the Fisheries Research and Development Fund.

These estimates are based on the number of licenses and stamps issued during the 2002 fishing season, the most recent data available, and assume that license sales will remain constant. DNR notes that, in recent years, fishing license sales have decreased nationally. To the extent license sales decrease, the increase in revenues under the bill would be less.

State Expenditures: While the bill would not require additional expenditures, DNR advises that it anticipates using the revenue generated under the bill for planned activities that, due to budget cutbacks, increasing administrative costs, and declining license sales, DNR does not have the resources to undertake. With the revenue generated for the Fisheries Management and Protection Fund, DNR plans to develop fisheries management SB 60 / Page 5

plans for brook trout, rainbow trout, brown trout, and black bass; implement a nontidal black bass project; identify, quantify, and map habitat-rich areas supporting naturally reproducing target species that sustain recreational fisheries; increase shoreline access and regional pond management and fisheries; and improve habitats. With the revenue generated for the Fisheries Research and Development Fund, DNR plans to increase monitoring of finfish stocks for data-rich virtual population analysis assessments, multiple species interactions, and shallow water ecosystem fish population assessments; implement a tidal black bass project; increase shoreline access; and implement a catfish restoration and management project.

The Governor's proposed fiscal 2005 budget includes \$3.3 million in general funds, \$7.3 million in special funds, and \$3.6 million in federal funds for the Fisheries Service. It does not assume receipts from the bill's proposed fee increases.
