(Senators DeGrange and Jimeno)

Vehicle Laws - Van-Accessible Parking for Individuals with Disabilities - Restrictions

This bill prohibits a person from parking a motor vehicle in a space designated as "van accessible" for the use of individuals with disabilities unless: (1) the person is authorized to use the space and the vehicle bears a special registration plate or a temporary or removable placard duly issued to individuals with disabilities by the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) or similarly by another state, the District of Columbia, or another country; and (2) the vehicle is capable of registration as a Class M (multipurpose) vehicle.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Potential minimal increase in general fund revenues due to the bill's penalty provision. No effect on expenditures.

Local Effect: The bill is not expected to substantively affect local operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: A person is prohibited from parking a motor vehicle in a space designated for the use of individuals with disabilities unless: (1) the vehicle bears a special registration plate, a removable or temporary removable placard issued by the MVA or a similar insignia issued by another state, the District of Columbia, or another

country; and (2) the person is authorized to use the privileges conferred by the plate or placard issued by the MVA, the District of Columbia, or another country. A person who parks a motor vehicle in violation of this provision is guilty of a misdemeanor, with a maximum fine of \$500. The penalty currently imposed by the District Court is \$125.

State Revenues: General fund revenues could increase minimally under the bill's monetary penalty provision for those cases heard in the District Court.
