House Bill 952 (Delegate Barve)

Health and Government Operations

Hospitals - Medical Residency Education Programs - Resident and Intern Duty Hours

This bill requires each hospital that offers a medical residency education program to comply with duty hour requirements for medical residents and interns established by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education. In addition, a hospital must develop and implement policies that provide medical residents with an opportunity to sleep for a minimum of four hours within each 24-hour time period that the resident is on duty.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill would not materially affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: There are no statutory limitations placed on duty hours for medical residents at teaching hospitals.

Background: The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education has developed duty hour standards for medical residents. In general, they cap hours for physicians in training at 80 hours per week, limit continuous duty time to 24 hours, require rest periods between duty shifts, and one day in seven must be free of any program responsibilities.
