FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 404 Judiciary (Delegate Dumais)

Real Property - Wrongful Detainer - Married Individuals

This bill provides that one spouse may not bring an action to eject the other spouse who: (1) holds possession of a property without the right of possession (wrongful detainer); or (2) refuses to surrender property after delivery of a deed, in violation of a written agreement to deliver possession at a specified time.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Any slight decrease in filings should have a negligible impact on the District Court's workload and finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Maryland law contains procedures to eject (1) a person who holds possession of a property without the right of possession (wrongful detainer); or (2) a grantor who refuses to surrender property after delivery of a deed, in violation of a written agreement to deliver possession at a specified time. There is no spousal exception in either statute.
