### Allegany County Board of Education - Membership - Qualifications

This bill alters the length of time that an individual nominated for membership as an elected member of the Allegany County Board of Education must be a resident of the county from three years to one year.

The bill is effective July 1, 2004.

# **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None.

**Local Effect:** None. The bill would not directly affect local government finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

# **Analysis**

**Current Law:** There are five members of the Allegany County Board of Education. Each member serves a four-year term and is elected from the county at-large.

**Background:** Twelve counties currently elect members of local boards of education and 10 counties and Baltimore City have boards comprised of appointed members. The Worcester County Board of Education is in the process of changing from an appointed board to an elected board, which will be complete following the 2004 general election. **Exhibit 1** shows the method of selecting school board members in each local jurisdiction.

A referendum to change the Cecil County Board of Education to an elected board will be on the 2004 general election ballot. The Dorchester County and Prince George's County Boards of Education will revert to elected members following the 2006 general election.
