FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 655 Ways and Means (Delegate Fulton)

Education - Public Schools - Promotion of Students

This bill repeals the authority of the State Board of Education to set rules and regulations for the promotion of public school students to the next grade level. Local boards of education are required to establish written policies for the promotion of students based on: (1) the student's achievement; (2) the student's age; (3) the uniqueness of the student; (4) the student's needs; (5) the student's developmental level; and (6) the student's ability level.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2004.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: If necessary, local school systems could update policies for the promotion of students with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The promotion of students in public schools and graduation from a public high school are in accordance with policies established by local boards of education and the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education.

Background: The Maryland State Department of Education advises that local boards of education establish written student promotion policies. Although it has the authority to do so, the State Board of Education has never issued student promotion regulations.
