House Bill 995 (St. Mary's County Delegation)

Affairs

St. Mary's County - Alcoholic Beverages - Special Wine Festival Licenses

This bill specifies that a special wine festival (WF) license issued in St. Mary's County may only be issued to the sponsor of a wine festival.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2004.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: None. Specifying that the sponsor of a wine festival may be the only licensee of a special wine festival in St. Mary's County would not affect county finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The St. Mary's County Alcoholic Beverages Board may issue a special WF license. An applicant for a special WF license must be the holder of an existing retail alcoholic beverages license issued in Maryland that authorizes the sale of wine, a Class 3 winery license, or a Class 4 limited winery license.

A license for the sale of alcoholic beverages in St. Mary's County must be issued to a corporation in which at least 15% of the owners of stock are residents of St. Mary's County who have lived in the county for at least six months preceding the application for a license.

Background: St. Mary's County advises that the sponsor of a special wine festival must meet the residency requirements of the special WF license. Accordingly, wineries who conduct their operations in a county other than St. Mary's County cannot be the sponsor of a special wine festival.
