Prince George's County - Alcoholic Beverages - Open Containers PG 310-04

This bill prohibits in Prince George's County, unless authorized in writing by the owner of an establishment, the possession of an open container of any alcoholic beverage in specified areas including shopping centers, retail establishments, and any parked vehicle at a shopping center or retail establishment.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Potential minimal increase in general fund revenues due to cases heard in the District Court.

Local Effect: Enforcement of open container laws in Prince George's County could be handled with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: Potential meaningful. The county's 147 Class A (off-sale) licensed establishments could benefit from the prohibition against open containers due to less loitering in front of retail off-sale establishments.

Analysis

Current Law: In Allegany, Baltimore, Calvert, Caroline, Carroll, Cecil, Charles, Dorchester, Frederick, Garrett, Harford, Howard, Montgomery, St. Mary's, and Somerset counties, it is illegal to possess in an open container any alcoholic beverage while in specified areas. However, open containers are permitted in specified areas in some of these counties if the person possesses and presents written consent of the property owner.

A violator is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction is subject to a fine not to exceed \$100. If the individual is under 18, the individual will be prosecuted as a juvenile. If the individual is 18 or over, the individual will be prosecuted as an adult in District Court. The vast majority of alcoholic beverages violations (for persons at least 18 years old) are adjudicated in the District Court.
