- 9 lighting to certain areas in a facility; requiring emergency electrical power to be
- provided to certain areas and equipment; requiring certain facilities to provide
- 11 common areas or areas of refuge for certain patients under certain
- 12 circumstances; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations regarding
- common areas and areas of refuge; and generally relating to assisted living
- program facilities and emergency electrical power generators.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 22 Article Health General
- 23 19-1808.
- 24 (A) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUIRE THAT EACH ASSISTED LIVING
- 25 PROGRAM FACILITY THAT PROVIDES SERVICES TO SIX OR MORE INDIVIDUALS HAVE
- 26 AN EMERGENCY ELECTRICAL POWER GENERATOR ON THE PREMISES.
- 27 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUIRE THAT EACH FACILITY PROVIDE
- 28 EMERGENCY ELECTRICAL POWER AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.

1 (C) THE EMERGENCY POWER SOURCE SHALL BE A GENERATING SET (1) 2 AND PRIME MOVER LOCATED ON THE FACILITY PREMISES WITH AUTOMATIC 3 TRANSFER. AN EMERGENCY POWER SYSTEM SHALL MEET THE FOLLOWING (2) 5 REQUIREMENTS: IN THE EVENT OF FAILURE OF THE NORMAL ELECTRIC 6 (I) 7 SERVICE, THE EMERGENCY ELECTRICAL POWER SHALL BE ACTIVATED 8 IMMEDIATELY: 9 THE EMERGENCY GENERATOR SET SHALL COME TO FULL (II)10 SPEED AND LOAD ACCEPTANCE WITHIN 10 SECONDS; AND (III)THE EMERGENCY GENERATOR SHALL HAVE THE CAPABILITY 12 OF 48 HOURS OF OPERATION FROM FUEL STORED ON-SITE. THE EMERGENCY POWER SYSTEM SHALL BE TESTED ONE TIME 13 (I) 14 EACH MONTH. THE EMERGENCY POWER SYSTEM TEST SHALL REQUIRE THAT 15 (II)16 THE GENERATOR BE EXERCISED FOR A MINIMUM OF 30 MINUTES UNDER NORMAL 17 EMERGENCY FACILITY CONNECTED LOAD. THE TEST SHALL BE RECORDED IN A PERMANENT LOG BOOK 18 (III)19 MAINTAINED FOR THAT PURPOSE. THE EMERGENCY POWER SYSTEM SHALL PROVIDE LIGHTING IN THE 20 (D) 21 FOLLOWING AREAS OF THE FACILITY: 22 AREAS OF EGRESS AND PROTECTION AS REQUIRED BY THE STATE (1) 23 FIRE PREVENTION CODE AND LIFE SAFETY CODE 101 ADOPTED BY THE STATE FIRE 24 MARSHAL'S OFFICE; 25 (2) **NURSES' STATION:** 26 (3) DRUG DISTRIBUTION STATION OR UNIT DOSE STATION; AN AREA FOR EMERGENCY TELEPHONE USE; 27 (4) 28 (5) BOILER OR MECHANICAL ROOM; 29 (6) KITCHEN; 30 (7) EMERGENCY GENERATOR LOCATION AND SWITCH GEAR LOCATION; ELEVATOR, IF OPERABLE ON EMERGENCY POWER; 31 (8) AREAS WHERE LIFE SUPPORT EQUIPMENT IS USED; 32 (9) 33 (10)IF APPLICABLE, COMMON AREAS OR AREAS OF REFUGE; AND

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- 1 (11)IF APPLICABLE, TOILET ROOMS OF COMMON AREAS OR AREAS OF 2 REFUGE. 3 (E) EMERGENCY ELECTRIC POWER SHALL BE PROVIDED FOR THE 4 FOLLOWING: 5 (1) NURSES' CALL SYSTEM; AT LEAST ONE TELEPHONE IN ORDER TO MAKE AND RECEIVE CALLS; 6 (2) 7 FIRE PUMP; (3) 8 (4) SEWERAGE PUMP AND SUMP PUMP; 9 (5) IF REQUIRED FOR EVACUATION PURPOSES, AN ELEVATOR; 10 (6) IF NECESSARY, HEATING EQUIPMENT NEEDED TO MAINTAIN A 11 MINIMUM TEMPERATURE OF 70 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT (24 DEGREES CELSIUS) IN 12 ALL COMMON AREAS OR AREAS OF REFUGE; LIFE SUPPORT EQUIPMENT; AND 13 (7) 14 NONFLAMMABLE MEDICAL GAS SYSTEMS. (8)
- 15 (F) (1) IF THE EMERGENCY POWER SYSTEM DOES NOT PROVIDE HEAT TO 16 ALL PATIENT ROOMS OR TOILET ROOMS IN THE EVENT OF A LOSS OF ELECTRICITY 17 FROM THE MAIN SOURCE OF POWER, THE FACILITY SHALL PROVIDE COMMON AREAS 18 OR AREAS OF REFUGE FOR ALL PATIENTS.
- 19 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS REGARDING THE 20 REQUIREMENTS FOR DESIGNATING PARTS OF THE FACILITY AS COMMON AREAS OR 21 AREAS OF REFUGE.
- 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 23 October 1, 2005.
