(i) Shall be a member of the general public;
(ii) May not be involved in any way with the activities on which the 14 Commission advises the Secretary; and

15 (iii) May not, within 1 year before appointment, have had a 16 financial interest in or have received compensation from a person who is involved in 17 any way with the activities on which the Commission advises the Secretary.

18 (2) While a member of the Commission, the consumer member may not 19 have a financial interest in or receive compensation from a person who is involved in
20 any way with the activities on which the Commission advises the Secretary.
21 (c) The term of membership is 3 years. A person may not serve more than two 22 consecutive terms. Members of the Commission appointed before January 1, 1973,
23 may continue to serve until the expiration of their terms. New appointments shall be
24 made from nominees of the industry, profession, or organization represented by the
25 member whose term is expiring.
26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
27 October 1, 2005.
