BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 **Article - Agriculture** 4 3-101. 5 The Secretary shall protect the health of the domestic animals of the State (a) 6 from all contagious or infectious diseases. For this purpose, the Secretary may: Adopt and enforce quarantine, sanitary, or other rules and (1) 8 regulations he deems necessary; (2)Make and prosecute diligent inquiries in the several counties to 10 ascertain the exact condition of the health of the livestock; and 11 (3) Notwithstanding § 3-102, prohibit the importation from another 12 state of any animal he has reason to believe is infected with or has been exposed to a 13 contagious or infectious disease and detain the animal at any place for inspection or 14 quarantine. 15 The Secretary may establish, maintain, and enforce a quarantine order if 16 he determines it is urgent and necessary for the prompt performance of the provisions provided in this section. 18 The Secretary may adopt rules and regulations governing the importation (c) 19 of domestic animals into the State from another state.
