BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 16 **Article - Agriculture** 17 3-101. The Secretary shall protect the health of the domestic animals of the State 18 19 from all contagious or infectious diseases. For this purpose, the Secretary may: 20 Adopt and enforce quarantine, sanitary, or other rules and 21 regulations he deems necessary;

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- 1 (2) Make and prosecute diligent inquiries in the several counties to 2 ascertain the exact condition of the health of the livestock; and
- 3 Notwithstanding § 3-102, prohibit the importation from another
- 4 state of any animal he has reason to believe is infected with or has been exposed to a
- 5 contagious or infectious disease and detain the animal at any place for inspection or
- 6 quarantine.
- 7 (b) The Secretary may establish, maintain, and enforce a quarantine order if
- 8 he determines it is urgent and necessary for the prompt performance of the provisions

- 10 (c) The Secretary may adopt rules and regulations governing the importation
