	States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit where Marshall's skills as a jurist were
	evidenced by the fact that none of his majority decisions was ever reversed by the
	United States Supreme Court; and
24	WHEREAS, After being appointed to the office of United States Solicitor General
25	in 1965, Thurgood Marshall represented and won more cases before the United States
	Supreme Court than any other American; and
