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- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 2 effect October 1, 2005. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end
- 3 of September 30, 2008, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 4 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
