38 NOT LESS THAN 5 YEARS, AND IF CERTIFIED AS A DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 (a) There is a Task Force on Assistance to Disabled Veterans Establishing
19 Small Businesses.

20 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

21 (1) two members of the Maryland General Assembly's Veterans Caucus,
22 appointed as follows:

23 (i) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the
24 President of the Senate; and

14 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State
