23 SCOUTS, WHO HAS AT LEAST A 10% SERVICE CONNECTED DISAPHINTY AND WHO IS

23 SCOUTS, WHO HAS AT LEAST A 10% SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITY AND WHO IS24 DOMICILED IN THE STATE.

27 (I) THAT IS ORGANIZED TO ENGAGE IN COMMERCIAL

29 (II) THAT IS AT LEAST 51% OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY ONE OR
30 MORE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE DISABLED VETERANS;

31(III)THAT IS MANAGED BY ONE OR MORE OF THE DISABLED32VETERANS WHO OWN IT;

33 (IV) THAT HAS ITS HOME OFFICE OR PRIMARY PLACE OF BUSINESS34 IN THE STATE;

1 (V) THAT HAS SUBMITTED COPIES OF ITS FEDERAL TAX RETURNS 2 FOR THE PAST 3 YEARS TO THE CERTIFICATION AGENCY AT THE TIME OF 3 CERTIFICATION;

4 (VI) FOR WHICH ONE OR MORE OF THE DISABLED VETERANS WHO 5 OWN IT CONTROL THE DAILY BUSINESS OPERATIONS; AND

6 (VII) FOR WHICH A DISABLED VETERAN ACTUALLY PERFORMS, 7 MANAGES, OR SUPERVISES THE WORK PERFORMED UNDER A CONTRACT.

(2) "DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE" INCLUDES:

9 (I) A SOLE PROPRIETORSHIP THAT IS AT LEAST 51% OWNED BY 10 ONE OR MORE DISABLED VETERANS OR A PUBLICLY OWNED BUSINESS IN WHICH 51% 11 OF THE STOCK IS OWNED BY ONE OR MORE DISABLED VETERANS;

12 (II) A SUBSIDIARY WHICH IS WHOLLY OWNED BY A PARENT 13 CORPORATION IN WHICH AT LEAST 51% OF THE VOTING STOCK IS OWNED BY ONE OR 14 MORE DISABLED VETERANS;

(III) A JOINT VENTURE IN WHICH AT LEAST 51% OF THE JOINT
VENTURE'S MANAGEMENT, CONTROL, AND EARNINGS ARE HELD BY ONE OR MORE
DISABLED VETERANS; AND

18 (IV) A LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY IF IT IS WHOLLY OWNED BY19 ONE OR MORE DISABLED VETERANS.

1 (ii) fraud, embezzlement, theft, forgery, falsification or destruction 2 of records, or receiving stolen property;

3 (2) been convicted of a criminal violation of an antitrust statute of the 4 State, another state, or the United States;

5 (3) been convicted of a violation of the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt 6 Organization Act, or the Mail Fraud Act, for acts in connection with the submission of 7 bids or proposals for a public or private contract;

8 (4) been convicted of a violation of § 14-308 of this article;

9 (5) been convicted of conspiracy to commit any act or omission that 10 would constitute grounds for conviction under any of the laws or statutes described in

11 paragraphs (1), (2), (3), or (4) of this subsection; [or]

12 (6) been found civilly liable under an antitrust statute of the State,
13 another state, or the United States for acts or omissions in connection with the
14 submission of bids or proposals for a public or private contract; OR

15 (7) BEEN CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF § 14-607(A) OF THIS ARTICLE.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 17 October 1, 2005.
