- 14 (a) The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, in conjunction with the

- 16 Pharmacy, shall convene a workgroup of authorized prescribers, including physicians,
- 17 dentists, podiatrists, and nurses; pharmacists; hospitals; long-term care facilities;
- 18 and local health departments to study the issue of legibility of prescriptions and make
- 19 recommendations for any statutory or regulatory changes needed to improve
- 20 prescription legibility in order to enhance patient safety.
