UNOFFICIAL COPY OF HOUSE BILL 291 MEMBERS OF THE OCEAN PINES POLICE DEPARTMENT HAVE 2 CONCURRENT JURISDICTION IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES WITH THE 3 LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES OF THE STATE AND OF WORCESTER COUNTY.
