5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Six
6 Hundred Sixty-Five Million, ~~Three Hundred Thirty Five~~ Four Hundred
7 Forty-Three Thousand Dollars ~~(\$665,335,000)~~ (\$665,443,000) the proceeds to be
8 used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning,
9 renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this
10 State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to
11 certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain purposes, subject to the
12 requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain
13 type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds
14 evidencing the loan; *altering a provision of law to allow the Maryland Stadium*
15 *Authority to use certain funds for certain studies*; providing for certain

programs in prior capital budget acts; providing that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loan acts be reduced by certain amounts; providing for certain additional information to be detailed about each project in the capital program; repealing a requirement for a certain appropriation; altering the membership of the Interagency Committee on School Construction; prohibiting certain individuals from being appointed as members of the Interagency Committee on School Construction; clarifying that the Interagency Committee on School Construction is a public body that is subject to the Open Meetings Law; requiring certain functions to be considered quasi-legislative for certain purposes under the Open Meetings Law; limiting the school construction projects that can be approved by the Board of Public Works by a certain date for a certain fiscal year; altering the membership of the Capital Debt Affordability Committee; and generally relating to the financing of certain capital projects.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
MARYLAND, That:

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2005 in the total principal amount of ~~\$665,335,000~~ \$665,443,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

(2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:
