# 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

19 (a) (1) [A] SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 20 SUBSECTION, A person may not fwillfully destroy, damage, deface, or remove:

21 [(1)] (I) an associated funerary object or another structure placed in a 22 cemetery; or

1 [(2)] (II) a building, wall, fence, railing, or other work, for the use, 2 protection, or ornamentation of a cemetery.

3 (2) THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION DO NOT
4 PROHIBIT THE REMOVAL OF A FUNERARY OBJECT OR A BUILDING, WALL, FENCE,
5 RAILING, OR OTHER OBJECT INSTALLED FOR THE USE, PROTECTION, OR
6 ORNAMENTATION OF A CEMETERY OR BURIAL SITE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF REPAIR
7 OR REPLACEMENT, EITHER AT THE REQUEST OF OR WITH THE PERMISSION OF HEIRS
8 OR DESCENDANTS OF THE DECEASED OR THE OWNER OR MANAGER OF THE
9 CEMETERY OR BURIAL SITE.

10 (b) (1) [A] SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
11 SUBSECTION, A person may not {willfully} destroy, damage, or remove a tree, plant,
12 or shrub in a cemetery.

(2) THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION DO NOT
 PROHIBIT NORMAL MAINTENANCE OF A CEMETERY OR BURIAL SITE, INCLUDING
 TRIMMING OF TREES AND SHRUBS, REMOVAL OF WEEDS OR NOXIOUS GROWTHS,
 GRASS CUTTING, OR OTHER ROUTINE CARE AND MAINTENANCE.

17 (c) A person may not engage in indecent or disorderly conduct in a cemetery.

18 (d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on19 conviction is subject to:

20 (1) for a violation of subsection (a) of this section, imprisonment not 21 exceeding 5 years or a fine not exceeding \$10,000 or both; and

22 (2) for a violation of subsection (b) or (c) of this section, imprisonment not 23 exceeding 2 years or a fine not exceeding \$500 or both.

24 (e) This section does not prohibit the removal of human remains or a funerary 25 object from an abandoned cemetery if:

26 (1) the removal is authorized in writing by the State's Attorney of the 27 county in which the cemetery containing the human remains or funerary object is 28 located; and

29 (2) the human remains or funerary object are placed in an accessible30 place in a permanent cemetery.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2005.
