A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Montgomery County - Alcoholic Beverages - Additional Licenses in**
 3 **Designated Enterprise Zones**
 4 **MC 506-05**

5 FOR the purpose of allowing an alcoholic beverages licensee in Montgomery County
 6 to obtain an additional license in a designated enterprise zone, including the one
 7 for Silver Spring, even after the incentives and initiatives for a business entity
 8 in the designated enterprise zone are eliminated or reduced; and generally
 9 relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Montgomery County.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

23 9-102.1.

24 (a) This section applies only in Montgomery County.

25 (b) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

26 (2) "Board" means the Board of License Commissioners.

1 (3) "Enterprise zone" has the meaning specified in Article 83A, § 5-401(f)
2 of the Code.

3 (4) "License" means a Class B beer, wine and liquor on-sale only license.

4 (5) "Original license" means a Class B license as set forth in § 6-201(q) of
5 this article.

6 (f) (1) A licensee may obtain not more than two additional licenses for
7 premises which meet the qualifications specified in this subsection. For identification
8 purposes, this additional license may be referred to as an enterprise zone license.

9 (2) Each restaurant shall be located within one of two designated
10 enterprise zones, with not more than one restaurant in each enterprise zone.

11 (3) The requirement that the holder have been a licensee for 1 year does
12 not apply to this subsection.

13 (4) A LICENSEE MAY OBTAIN AN ADDITIONAL LICENSE FOR A PREMISES
14 IN A DESIGNATED ENTERPRISE ZONE, EVEN AFTER THE INCENTIVES AND
15 INITIATIVES FOR A BUSINESS ENTITY IN THE DESIGNATED ENTERPRISE ZONE ARE
16 ELIMINATED OR REDUCED.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
18 June 1, 2005.
