1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Workers' Compensation - Evaluation of Permanent Impairments**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring physicians to medically evaluate permanent
4 impairments using the most recent edition of the American Medical
5 Association's Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment, as amended;
6 and requiring the Workers' Compensation Commission to adopt regulations
7 governing the reports of physicians' medical evaluations of permanent
8 impairments.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article - Labor and Employment**

22 [9-721.

23 (a) A physician shall evaluate a permanent impairment and report the
24 evaluation to the Commission in accordance with the regulations of the Commission.

25 (b) A medical evaluation of a permanent impairment shall include information
26 about:

27 (1) atrophy;

- 1 (2) pain;
- 2 (3) weakness; and
- 3 (4) loss of endurance, function, and range of motion.]

5 (A) A PHYSICIAN SHALL MEDICALLY EVALUATE A PERMANENT IMPAIRMENT
6 USING THE MOST RECENT EDITION OF THE AMERICAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION'S
7 GUIDES TO THE EVALUATION OF PERMANENT IMPAIRMENTS, AS AMENDED.

8 (B) THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT GOVERN THE
9 REPORTING OF A PHYSICIAN'S MEDICAL EVALUATION OF A PERMANENT
10 IMPAIRMENT TO THE COMMISSION.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 October 1, 2005.
