- FOR the purpose of prohibiting, in Cecil County, a person from standing, or causing,
- encouraging, allowing, or petitioning another to stand, in a roadway, median 5
- divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations from the occupant of a 6
- vehicle, subject to a certain exception; authorizing the County Commissioners of 7
- 8 Cecil County or the governing body of a municipal corporation in Cecil County to
- 9 enact a certain permit program to allow individuals who are at least a certain
- 10 age and representatives of certain organizations who are at least a certain age to
- solicit money or donations from the occupant of a vehicle by standing in a 11
- roadway, median divider, or intersection; requiring an applicant for a certain 12
- 13 permit to submit proof of adequate liability insurance and a certain safety plan;
- 14 providing that a permit issued under this Act only be effective for a certain time
- 15 period; providing that an individual or a certain organization may only obtain a
- 16 certain number of a certain permit per calendar year; defining certain terms;

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 24
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Transportation** 2 21-507. Except for the occupant of a disabled vehicle who seeks the aid of another 3 (a) 4 vehicle, a person may not stand in a roadway to solicit a ride, employment, or 5 business from the occupant of any vehicle. A person may not stand on or near a highway to solicit any other person to 6 watch or guard any vehicle while it is parked or about to be parked on a highway. 8 In Charles County, Frederick County, Harford County, and Washington (c) 9 County, a person may not stand in a roadway, median divider, or intersection to solicit 10 money or donations of any kind from the occupant of a vehicle. 11 (d) (1) In Prince George's County: 12 A child under the age of 15 years may not stand in a roadway, 13 median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations of any kind from the 14 occupant of a vehicle; and 15 An adult may not cause, encourage, allow, or petition a child 16 under the age of 15 years to stand in a roadway, median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations of any kind from the occupant of a vehicle. 18 A child under the age of 15 years may not be found guilty or 19 adjudicated delinquent for a violation of paragraph (1)(i) of this subsection if an adult 20 caused, encouraged, allowed, or petitioned the child in violation of paragraph (1)(ii) of 21 this subsection. 22 (e) (1) This subsection applies to Anne Arundel County. 23 In this subsection, "qualified organization" means a fire company or a 24 bona fide religious, fraternal, civic, war veterans', or charitable organization. 25 The Anne Arundel County Council may, by ordinance, enact a (3) 26 licensing program for individuals who are 18 years old or older and qualified 27 organizations that wish to solicit money or donations from the occupant of a vehicle 28 by standing in a roadway, median divider, or intersection. 29 The restriction on the age of individuals who may be licensed under (4) 30 the authority granted to the Anne Arundel County Council under paragraph (3) of 31 this subsection applies to individuals who participate in the solicitation of donations 32 as members or on behalf of the qualified organization. 33 If the county council enacts an ordinance establishing a licensing
