A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Kent County - Alcoholic Beverages - Fines**

3 FOR the purpose of increasing the maximum amount of fines that the Board of
4 License Commissioners of Kent County may impose for first, second, and third
5 or subsequent violations of alcoholic beverages provisions; and generally
6 relating to alcoholic beverages in Kent County.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

20 16-507.

21 (p) (1) This subsection applies only in Kent County.

22 (2) Except as provided otherwise, the Board of License Commissioners
23 may impose the following penalties for a violation of any provision of this article:

24 (i) For the first offense:

25 1. Suspension of the license;

1 2. Closure of the place of business for not more than 15 days;

2 and

3 3. A fine not exceeding [\$500] \$1,000;

4 (ii) For the second offense:

5 1. Suspension of the license;

6 2. Closure of the place of business for not more than 30 days;

7 and

8 3. A fine not exceeding [\$1,000] \$2,000;

9 (iii) For the third or subsequent offense:

10 1. Suspension of the license;

11 2. Closure of the place of business for not more than 90 days;

12 and

13 3. A fine not exceeding [\$2,000] \$2,500; and

14 (iv) For a third offense that is the same as either of the 2 previous

15 offenses:

16 1. Revocation of the license;

17 2. Prohibition of licensure of the violator; and

18 3. Prohibition of licensure of the premises for a period of not
19 more than 1 year from the date of the revocation of the license.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
21 July 1, 2005.
