17 18	 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21	(a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.			
22	(b) "Board" means the State Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners.			
23 24	(c) "License" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a license issued by the Board to practice podiatry.			
25 26	(d) "Licensed podiatrist" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a podiatrist who is licensed by the Board to practice podiatry.			

"Podiatrist" means an individual who practices podiatry.

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1 (f) (1) "Practice podiatry" means to diagnose or surgically, medically, or

2 mechanically treat [any ailment of] the human foot or ankle, [or any ailment of] the

3 anatomical structures that attach to the human foot, OR THE SOFT TISSUE BELOW

4 THE MID-CALF.

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(2) "Practice podiatry" does not include:

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(i) Surgical treatment of acute ankle fracture; or

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(ii) Administration of an anesthetic, other than a local anesthetic.

9 (a) All surgical procedures of the ankle below the level of the dermis,

10 arthrodeses of 2 or more tarsal bones, and complete tarsal osteotomies that are
