## 1 AN ACT concerning

- 2 Adoption - Placement Services for Children in Public Foster Care - State 3 **Contracts with Private Licensed Child Placement Agencies**
- FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Human Resources to allocate not 4
- less than a certain amount of money from the Department's fiscal year 2006 5
- budget appropriations to develop, implement, and monitor a program though 6
- 7 through which qualified licensed child placement agencies may enter into
- contracts with the State to provide adoption placement services for Maryland 8
- 9 children in public foster care who have no identified permanency resource;
- requiring that certain contracts be awarded according to certain competitive 10
- bidding procedures; and generally relating to the placement of children in public 11
- 12 foster care in permanent adoption arrangements.

13 Preamble

- 14 WHEREAS, There are approximately 500 Maryland children in public foster
- 15 care waiting to be adopted for whom there are no families currently identified as
- 16 being available to adopt them; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Many children in Maryland foster care have been waiting for more
- 18 than 5 years to be placed for adoption; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Adoption presents the best opportunity for permanency when
- 20 children in public foster care are unable to be safely raised by their birth families; and

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- WHEREAS, There are many licensed private child placement agencies within
- 2 and outside of Maryland that have the knowledge, expertise, and ability to place
- 3 children for adoption who are in public foster care; and
- 4 WHEREAS, There are many families in Maryland who are adopting children in
- 5 public foster care from other states that provide financial assistance to adoption
- 6 agencies to help defray the costs of their services; and
- WHEREAS, The State of Maryland does not currently make financial resources
- 8 available to enter into contracts with licensed private child placement agencies to
- 9 enable those agencies to place children from public foster care for adoption; now,
- 10 therefore,
- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That:
- 13 (1) the Department of Human Resources shall allocate not less than
- 14 \$500,000 from the Department's fiscal year 2006 budget appropriations to develop,
- 15 implement, and monitor a program through which qualified licensed child placement
- 16 agencies may enter into contracts with the State to provide adoption placement
- 17 services for Maryland children in public foster care who have no identified
- 18 permanency resource; and
- 19 (2) contracts entered into with the State under this section shall be
- 20 awarded according to competitive bidding procedures for State procurement
- 21 contracts.
- 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 23 effect July 1, 2005.
