A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Workers' Compensation - Permanent Partial Disability - Petition to Reopen**

3 FOR the purpose of providing that if a covered employee receives additional  
4 compensation for a disability on a petition to reopen a certain claim, the  
5 additional compensation may not increase the amount of compensation  
6 previously awarded and paid.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article - Labor and Employment**

20 9-629.

21 (A) If a covered employee is awarded compensation for a period equal to or  
22 greater than 75 weeks but less than 250 weeks, the employer or its insurer shall pay  
23 the covered employee weekly compensation that equals two-thirds of the average  
24 weekly wage of the covered employee but does not exceed one-third of the State  
25 average weekly wage.

26 (B) IF A COVERED EMPLOYEE RECEIVES ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION FOR A  
27 DISABILITY ON A PETITION TO REOPEN A CLAIM, THE ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION

1 MAY NOT INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF COMPENSATION PREVIOUSLY AWARDED AND  
2 PAID.

4 (b) (2) Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, the Commission may  
5 modify any finding or order as the Commission considers justified.

6 (3) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, the Commission  
7 may not modify an award unless the modification is applied for within 5 years after  
8 the latter of:

9 (i) the date of the accident;

10 (ii) the date of disablement; or

11 (iii) the last compensation payment.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
13 October 1, 2005.
