- 15 (a) A person may not recklessly:
- 16 (1) engage in conduct that creates a substantial risk of death or serious 17 physical injury to another; or
- 18 (2) discharge a firearm from a motor vehicle in a manner that creates a 19 substantial risk of death or serious physical injury to another.
- 20 (b) A person who violates this section is guilty of the misdemeanor of reckless
- 21 endangerment and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 5 years or
- 22 a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.
- 23 (c) Subsection (a)(1) of this section does not apply to conduct involving[:
- 24 (i) the use of a motor vehicle, as defined in § 11-135 of the
- 25 Transportation Article; or

1 (ii)] the manufacture, production, or sale of a product or commodity. 2 (2) Subsection (a)(2) of this section does not apply to: 3 (i) a law enforcement officer or security guard in the performance 4 of an official duty; or 5 (ii) an individual acting in defense of a crime of violence as defined 6 in § 5-101 of the Public Safety Article. 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2005.
