A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Nursing Homes - Family Council - Administrative Functions**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing nursing homes to assist a family council in the
4 administrative functions of operating a family council under certain
5 circumstances; providing that the nursing home may assist the family council
6 for longer than a certain period of time under certain circumstances; and
7 generally relating to family councils and nursing homes.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article - Health - General**

21 19-1416.

22 (a) In this section, "family council" means a group of individuals who work
23 together to protect the rights of and improve the quality of life of residents of a
24 nursing home.

1 (b) (1) A family council for a nursing home may consist of the following
2 members:

3 (i) Members of a resident's family; or

4 (ii) An individual appointed by the resident, or if the resident is
5 incapable of appointing an individual, an individual appointed by the resident's
6 family.

7 (2) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, a family council
8 may be created by the owner, operator, or staff of a nursing home.

9 (ii) [In] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS
10 SUBSECTION, IN order to facilitate the development of a family council, the owner,
11 operator, or staff of a nursing home may lead the family council for no longer than 6
12 months at which time the family council shall be led by a member of the family
13 council.

14 (3) ON THE REQUEST OF A FAMILY COUNCIL, THE NURSING HOME MAY
15 ASSIST THE FAMILY COUNCIL IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS OF OPERATING
16 THE FAMILY COUNCIL IN A MUTUALLY AGREED UPON MANNER.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
18 effect July 1, 2005.
