A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws - Driver Education - Computer-Based Program**

3 FOR the purpose of including a computer-based driver education program that  
4 includes a certain amount of highway driving instruction as an option for  
5 satisfying a certain driver education requirement relating to examinations for a  
6 provisional license; authorizing the Motor Vehicle Administration to approve a  
7 computer-based driver education program; and generally relating to driver  
8 education programs.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
10 Article - Transportation  
11 Section 16-105(d)(2) and 16-505  
12 Annotated Code of Maryland  
13 (2002 Replacement Volume and 2004 Supplement)

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article - Transportation**

17 16-105.

18 (d) (2) An individual who holds a learner's instructional permit may not  
19 take a driver skills examination or driver road examination for a provisional license:

20 (i) Sooner than 4 months:

21 1. After the individual first obtains the learner's  
22 instructional permit; or

23 2. After the date on which the individual committed a  
24 moving violation for which the individual was convicted;

25 (ii) Until after successful completion of the driver education  
26 program approved under Subtitle 5 of this title, consisting of [at]:



1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
2 October 1, 2005.
