Task Force to Study Identity Theft

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study Identity Theft; specifying the

4 membership and duties of the Task Force; providing for the appointment of a

5 Senate co-chairman and House co-chairman of the Task Force; providing for the 6 staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from

receiving compensation for serving on the Task Force; authorizing a member of

8 the Task Force to receive reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring a

9 certain report on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of the

10 Task Force; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study Identity Theft.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That:

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26 July 1, 2005. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 7 months and, at the 27 end of January 31, 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, 28 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
