15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 20	(a) If an applicant for a physical therapy license has been educated in physical therapy in any state, the applicant shall have:
21 22	(1) Graduated from a physical therapy program that, in the year of graduation, was approved by:
23	(i) The American Medical Association;
24	(ii) The American Physical Therapy Association; or
25 26	(iii) The Commission on Accreditation of Physical Therapy Education; and

- 1 (2) Completed satisfactorily the clinical training required by the physical 2 therapy curriculum.

- 16 [onsite] supervision and instruction that is adequate to ensure the safety and welfare
- 17 of the patient.
