SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 (a) (1) In this section[, "pet"] THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 6 MEANINGS INDICATED.

7 (2) "COMPENSATORY DAMAGES" MEANS:

8 (I) IN THE CASE OF THE DEATH OF A PET, THE FAIR MARKET 9 VALUE OF THE PET BEFORE DEATH AND THE REASONABLE AND NECESSARY COST OF 10 VETERINARY CARE; AND

11 (II) IN THE CASE OF AN INJURY TO A PET, THE REASONABLE AND 12 NECESSARY COST OF VETERINARY CARE.

13 (3) (I) "PET" means a domesticated animal.

14 [(2)] (II) "Pet" does not include livestock.

15 (b) (1) [The measure of damages for tortious injuries to or death of a pet is

16 the market value of the pet before the injury or death or the reasonable cost of

17 veterinary care, but not more than \$5,000 if such charge is greater] A PERSON WHO

18 TORTIOUSLY CAUSES AN INJURY TO OR DEATH OF A PET WHILE ACTING

19 INDIVIDUALLY OR THROUGH AN ANIMAL UNDER THE PERSON'S DIRECTION OR

20 CONTROL IS LIABLE TO THE OWNER OF THE PET FOR COMPENSATORY DAMAGES.

(2) THE DAMAGES AWARDED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
SUBSECTION MAY NOT EXCEED \$10,000 \$7,500.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be

24 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have 25 any effect on or application to any cause of action that arises before the effective date 26 of this Act.

27 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28 October 1, 2005.
