4 FOR the purpose of increasing the maximum number of Class B (beer and light wine),
5 Class B (beer, wine and liquor), and Class BH (beer, wine and liquor) licenses
6 authorized to be issued in Prince George's County; providing that the additional
7 Class B licenses authorized by this Act and issued under State law do not confer
8 off-sale privileges; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in
9 Prince George's County.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

2 9-217.

3 (a) This section applies only in Prince George's County.

4 (b) The number of licenses of each class of alcoholic beverage licenses may not
5 exceed the following maximum amounts:

6 (6) Beer and light wine license, Class B [38] 45

7 (12) Beer, wine and liquor license, Class B [170] 185

8 (15) Beer, wine and liquor license, Class BH [20] 25

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That an additional Class B
10 license authorized by this Act and issued under Article 2B, § 9-217 of the Code does
11 not confer off-sale privileges.12 SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
13 effect October 1, 2005.
