- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 22 (1) meet the standards set by the Secretary;
- 23 (2) be an employee of or an applicant for employment with a licensed

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Higher 20 21 Education Commission shall include a private career school that provides security 22 guard training under §19-402 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article as 23 an eligible school under the Private Career School Student Grant Program 24 administered under Title 18, Subtitle 12 of the Education Article. 25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the requirements of this 26 Act shall be applicable to all security guard certifications issued on or after July 1, 27 2006.
