2 3	(d) A related institution that accepts an individual as a new resident or accepts an individual as a new employee after December 1 but before April 1 shall:
4 5	(1) Determine the individual's status for immunization as required under subsection (b) of this section; and

8 9	(e) A resident or employee is not required to receive a vaccine under this section if:
10	(1) The vaccine is medically contraindicated for the resident or employee;

	(2) If a resident or employee refuses to be immunized as required under subsection (b) of this section, the related institution shall document the refusal and the reason for the refusal.
