5 FOR the purpose of allocating a grant in a certain amount to the Maryland Higher

6 Education Commission to be distributed to community college boards and to the

7 Baltimore City Community College Board of Trustees on a certain basis;

8 requiring the boards and the Board of Trustees to use the funds for a certain

9 purpose; requiring the Commission, in consultation with the Maryland

10 Association of Community Colleges, to adopt certain regulations for the

11 administration of the grant; and generally relating to the funding of services

12 and programs for students with a documented disability at both community

13 colleges and the Baltimore City Community College.

16 (G) (1) (I) BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2007, AND EACH FISCAL YEAR
17 THEREAFTER, A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,500,000 SHALL BE ALLOCATED TO THE
18 COMMISSION FOR DISTRIBUTION TO THE BOARDS OF EACH COMMUNITY COLLEGE
19 AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE IN
20 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION.

21 (II) THE COMMISSION SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE GRANT ON A PER

6 <u>SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF</u> 7 <u>MARYLAND, That:</u>
8 (a) There is a Community College Students with Disabilities Task Force.
9 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
10(1)two members one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by11the President of the Senate;
12(2)two members one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the13Speaker of the House;
14(3)the Executive Director of the Maryland Association of Community15Colleges:
16(4)three representatives of community colleges, appointed by the17Secretary of Higher Education;
18(5)a community college student with a documented disability, appointed19by the Secretary of Higher Education;
20(6)the Director of the Developmental Disabilities Administration in the21Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, or a the Director's designee;
22(7)the Assistant State Superintendent for the Division of Rehabilitation23Services in the State Department of Education, or the Assistant State Superintendent's24designee:

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2 (1) identify programmatic and physical barriers for students with

4 (2) <u>identify gaps in resources for technology, equipment, and services for</u> 5 <u>students with disabilities;</u>

6 (3) develop strategies to improve educational and employment outcomes 7 for students with disabilities; and

8 (4) develop a series of recommendations that will result in Maryland

9 community colleges having the resources to actively serve students with disabilities

10 with the appropriate supports, services, and training necessary to achieve student

11 education and employment goals.

12 (f) The Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the

13 Governor, and the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State

14 Government Article, on or before December 1, 2005.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

16 July 1, 2005. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30,

17 2006, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be

18 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
