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Education - Closing the Gap School Recognition Awards Task Force to Study the Achievement Gap in Maryland Public Schools

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Closing the Gap School Recognition Awards

- 5 program to recognize primary and secondary schools which have made
- 6 significant efforts in reducing certain achievement gaps for certain students;
- 7 requiring the Governor to include a certain amount of certain federal funds in
- 8 the annual State budget under certain circumstances to fund the awards
- 9 program; requiring the State Superintendent to establish certain guidelines for
- 10 determining the eligibility for and distribution of award funds; requiring the
- 11 State Department of Education to annually determine and report to the General
- 12 Assembly, State Board, and county boards the primary and secondary schools
- 13 that have made gains in reducing certain achievement gaps for certain students;
- 14 requiring certain recipient schools to determine how award funds shall be used
- 15 to further reduce achievement gaps subject to certain limitations; requiring the
- 16 principal of a recipient school to file a certain report with the county
- 17 superintendent; requiring the county superintendent to file a certain report

18 with the county board, the State Superintendent, and the State Board; repealing

32 June 30, 2006, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall

33 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
