4 FOR the purpose of altering the amount of the death benefit for certain individuals

- 5 who are killed or die in the performance of duties; providing that an <u>a certain</u>
- 6 individual who dies from a heart attack or stroke shall be presumed to have died
- 7 in the performance of duties under certain circumstances; clarifying a certain
- 8 term; and generally relating to death benefits for employees killed in the

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
