3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from inflicting unnecessary suffering or pain

2 [(3)] (4) cause, procure, or authorize an act prohibited under [item (1) or 3 item (2)] ITEM (1), (2), OR (3) of this subsection; or

4 [(4)] (5) if the person has charge or custody of an animal, as owner or 5 otherwise[:

(i) inflict unnecessary suffering or pain on the animal; or

7 (ii)] , unnecessarily fail to provide the animal with nutritious food in
8 sufficient quantity, necessary veterinary care, proper drink, air, space, shelter, or
9 protection from the weather.

10 (b) (1) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on
11 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 90 days or a fine not exceeding
12 \$1,000 or both.

13 (2) As a condition of sentencing, the court may order a defendant
14 convicted of violating this section to participate in and pay for psychological
15 counseling.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 17 effect October 1, 2005.
