- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (b) A release may be endorsed on the original mortgage or deed of trust by the
- 18 mortgagee or his assignee, the trustee or his successor under a deed of trust, or by the
- 19 holder of the debt or obligation secured by the deed of trust. The mortgage or the deed
- 20 of trust, with the endorsed release, then shall be filed in the office in which the
- 21 mortgage or deed of trust is recorded. The clerk shall record the release
- 22 photographically, with an attachment or rider affixed to it containing the names of
- 23 the parties as they appear on the original mortgage or deed of trust, together with a
- 24 reference to the book and page number where the mortgage or deed of trust is
- 25 recorded. [When the mortgage or deed of trust, with the attached release, is filed for
- 26 the purpose of recording the release, the clerk shall retain the mortgage or deed of
- 27 trust in his office and not permit it to be withdrawn for 25 years, after which time he
- 28 may destroy it. If, however, the clerk preserves a photographic copy of the release, he
- 29 may permit the original mortgage or deed of trust with the release to be withdrawn.]

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 June 1, 2005.
