## 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## **Article - Transportation**

20 21-1101.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person driving or
otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave it unattended until the engine is
stopped, the ignition locked, the key removed, and the brake effectively set.

24 (b) A person driving or otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave 25 the motor vehicle unattended until, if the vehicle is on a grade, the front wheels are 26 turned to the curb or side of the highway.

1 (c) When a cat or dog is left in the unattended vehicle of an on-duty law

2 enforcement officer or an animal control officer, the provisions of subsection (a) of this

3 section do not apply to the law enforcement officer or the animal control officer.

5 (a) Any person who is convicted of a violation of § 22-404.4 of this article shall 6 be fined \$250.

7 (b) Any person who is convicted of a violation of § 22-412.3 of this article is 8 subject to a fine of not more than \$25, including court costs.

9 (c) Any person who is convicted of a violation of § 21-1003(u) or (dd) of this 10 article is subject to a fine of \$25.

11 (D) ANY PERSON WHO IS CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF § 21-1101(A) OF THIS 12 ARTICLE IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF \$250.
