3 FOR the purpose of providing that, in Baltimore City, on or before the start of the

- 4 2005 2006 school year <u>a certain date</u>, the Baltimore City Board of School
- 5 Commissioners shall ensure that the drinking water in school buildings under
- 6 its jurisdiction is lead free has a lead concentration level that is as low as
- 7 practicable but in no event exceeds a certain level is safe from lead in
- 8 accordance with certain federal standards and otherwise meets the standards
- 9 under certain drinking water regulations adopted by the Secretary of the
- 10 Environment; and generally relating to drinking water in Baltimore City public

3 IN BALTIMORE CITY, ON OR BEFORE THE START OF THE 2005 2006 SCHOOL YEAR 4 DECEMBER 31, 2005, THE BALTIMORE CITY BOARD OF SCHOOL COMMISSIONERS 5 SHALL ENSURE THAT THE DRINKING WATER IN EACH SCHOOL BUILDING UNDER ITS **6** JURISDICTION:

7 IS LEAD FREE HAS A LEAD CONCENTRATION LEVEL THAT IS AS LOW (1)8 AS PRACTICABLE BUT IN NO EVENT EXCEEDS 15 PARTS PER BILLION IS SAFE FROM 9 LEAD IN ACCORDANCE WITH FEDERAL STANDARDS GOVERNING THE PRESENCE OF 10 LEAD IN DRINKING WATER; AND

11 (2)OTHERWISE MEETS THE STANDARDS UNDER THE STATE PRIMARY 12 DRINKING WATER REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE SECRETARY OF THE 13 ENVIRONMENT UNDER TITLE 9, SUBTITLE 4 OF THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 July 1, 2005.

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
