1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Medical Assistance Program - Atypical Antipsychotic Medications

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene from
- 4 establishing, within certain pharmacy assistance programs in the Maryland
- Medical Assistance Program, prior authorization requirements for atypical
- 6 antipsychotic medications, including certain dosing specifications; providing
- that the preferred drug list developed by the Department for the Program may
- 8 not include atypical antipsychotic medications; prohibiting the Department
- 9 from establishing certain dosing limits for atypical antipsychotic medications
- prescribed under the Program; and generally relating to the Maryland Medical
- 11 Assistance Program and atypical antipsychotic medications.
